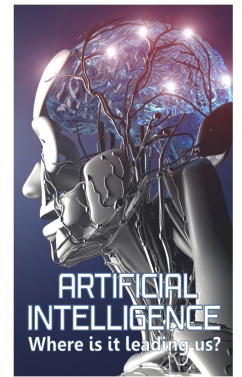

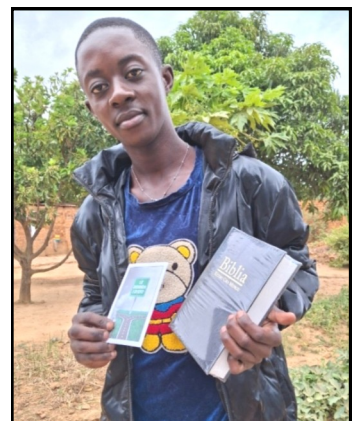
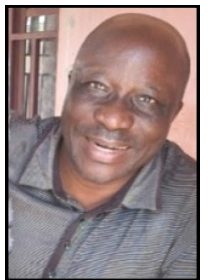
CHRISTMAS TRACT IN KILUBA COMING SOON

Febr. 2025

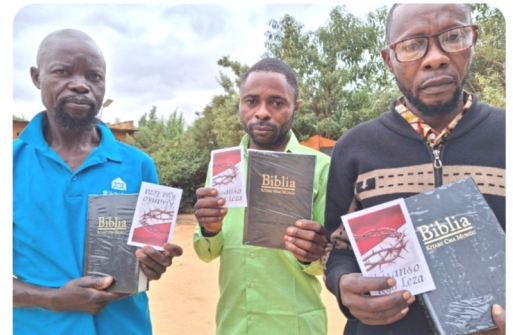
“Upon our arrival in Lubumbashi, we found many displaced people tormented by severe wars from the northeast of this country. It is so sad to see how they travelled 2000 kilometers from their areas...Most of them are sick and under great hunger and need Christ...Some of them lost everything and need care and comfort.”

“This man named Mufundiji (right) is teaching many people to read and to write...If he did not this great work, we could not give literature to this people... He has decided to come to Jesus when he read the tract “Which Way?” He told us that he likes when his wife reads Psalms 1 in her KJV Bible...”



“This man named Georges Kishimba (left) was one of the mayi-mayi militias who are practicing cannibalism in the Mitumba mountains. When he came to visit his grand-father, he found him reading his King James Bible, he asked him, ‘My grand-father, what are you reading in that book?’ So his grand-father gave him to read on the Ten Commandments from the book of Exodus. After his reading he asked his

grandfather: ‘Don’t kill is prohibited by God, even to kill my enemy?’ His grand-father replied him: ‘YES.’ And then his grand-father gave him a tract ‘Which Way?’ and he read the tract and all the Bible verses and after a few weeks, he decided to give his life to Jesus.”



“When we spent weeks in Konga Village, the Lord touched hearts of Kapya, Pierre and Bernard, they gave their lives to our Lord Jesus Christ. Kapya (above, left) was living in witchcraft but through reading the tract “The Love of God” and all the Scriptures quoted, he decided to receive Jesus Christ as personal Savior.”



“In Lubumbashi city, I and my wife Olivia (above, left) spent a week to hold a Bible class and free distributions of King James Bibles and Hope Tracts to displaced peoples from northeast of the country, where the wars extended-up to their areas. Through these missionary activities, the Lord led Janet, Musige and Ruth to Himself.”
